### **91** Domaine de Mourchon Côtes du Rhône Villages Séguret **G Family Reserve 2008**

\$60 Ripe and fleshy, especially for the vintage, with dark bittersweet ganache, fig, pepper, tobacco and cassis notes – J.M.

### **92** Domaine de Mourchon Côtes du Rhône Villages Séguret **Grande Réserve 2007**

\$25 This is impressive for its array of dark fig, espresso, current paste and hoisin sauce notes all laid over a tangy, mineral spine that drives the finish along. Mesquite, charcoal and braised beef notes add further dimension. Drink now through 2013. – J.M.

### **91** Domaine de Mourchon Côtes du Rhône Villages Séguret **S Family Reserve 2008**

\$50 Quite dark, offering admirable depth and richness for the vintage, with blackberry and linzer torte flavors. – J.M.

### **88** Domaine de Mourchon Côtes du Rhône Villages Séguret **Tradition 2007**

\$16 Fresh, with floral, red currant and blackberry fruit notes backed by a tangy, mineral-tinged finish. Juicy and racy. Grenache, Syrah and Carignan. Drink now through 2010.– J.M.

### **87** Domaine de Mourchon **Côtes du Rhône 2008**

\$11 Fresh and juicy, with open-knit red cherry and currant fruit laced with hints of garrigue and tobacco. There's a nice chalky twinge on the finish. Drink now. – J.M.
